# Enjoying an oasis of health



## History

Hortus Alkmaar was established in 1981 for the development of natural medicines and has its origin as a production garden. Over the years it was expanded to its current two-hectare dimension and the botanic collection grew to nearly 1000 species, 700 of which have medicinal qualities.

### **Hortus Alkmaar Foundation**

With the help of a group of enthusiastic supporters the garden was saved from closure in 2011. The collection is now cared for by the Hortus Alkmaar foundation, and has been made accessible to the public. Due to the support of many sponsors, friends, and about 80 volunteers the garden is now a popular location for many nature- and plant lovers.







# A large collection in a natural environment

What makes Hortus Alkmaar so unique is the variety of types and original species. Everything in the garden is grown organically, without the use of artificial fertilizers or pesticides. Since 1997 the garden has been certified by Skal and awarded the EKO Quality Mark. Our collection of medicinal plants is the largest in the Netherlands. The combination



of quality, knowledge, and manual care raises the interest of academic researchers.

# An abundance to see and experience

The alternation of production plant beds and theme- and biotope gardens makes the garden interesting. Among them are a swamp, dune flora, heath, rock-, and Mediterranean garden, central European flora, and an American and European forest and new this year: a garden with carnivorous plants.

# Kingfishers

This diversity creates an attractive habitat for birds and insects. Throughout the year over 40 bird species can be observed, including breeding Kingfishers, marsh warblers, and sparrowhawks. In summer you can find about 20 types of odonatas and butterflies.
